2 Course description, goals and textbooks

The goal of this course is to familiarize you with a set of fundamental and useful mathematical tools that are ubiquitous in economics. The stress is on application, but underlying theoretical assumptions are not neglected. We will cover *all* chapters of Chiang and Wainwright, more or less in sequential order.
